Rookie Draft:

- * Winner of the Toilet Bowl will receive the #1 pick for the rookie draft. Runner-up, the second pick.
- * The rest of the league will be a draft order set by Draft Order Program. Teams will be rated 3-12 by **Draft Order Program**.
- * Draft Order program will be used giving teams lotto balls, 3-12 by previous seasons finish.
- * Trading will begin March 1st, the new season year, before the draft
- * There will be 4 rounds and teams can draft up to 4 players. Trades could add more than 4 picks. Teams can pass on drafting a player and do not have to draft. Each team will receive **1 extension** to allow for trades (**3 minutes**). Def/ST can not be drafted.
- * Draft will be held online and will be allowed 3 minutes per pick. After 3 minutes the pick will be skipped if no player is selected. Skipped teams may pick a player after their time but can not pick a player for that round when the round is complete. **Note:** Additional time will be allowed due to the delay with the remote draft board. The delay can be from 15 - 30 seconds.
- * Draft picks for the following season can be traded. Trades can not exceed past 1 year.
- * Veteran players can be traded for draft picks and will carry over their ADP's and be put into ADP order with their new team.
- * Owner trades does not change the agreed picks by a leaving owner from the previous year. Trades will be honored.
- * All rookies not selected in the Rookie draft will be part of the regular season draft.
- * Rookies drafted do not have to be protected by the drafting team.
- * Before Mini Camp, rookies drafted, teams will need to release the same amount of players to get to the 20 player limit.
- * Rookies will be placed on the season draft board in the rounds 15-18 in ADP order. If more than 4 rookies, rounds 19 and 20 will be used and continue after 20, if needed, with the rookies. DynastyLeagueFootball.com, ADP's in June or July, will be used. The league will be notified with the final ADP date to be used for the rookie draft. This date will be as close as possible before the rookie draft.



What they Say

NFL and DLF on Draft Prospects



Joe Burrow

DLF - Best current skill – Level-headedness. Nothing rattles him. He played on some of the biggest stages in college football and had his back against the wall in a few of them. He keeps his composure and always keeps his head downfield. Burrow reads and takes what the defense gives him. He is dangerous on the run and not afraid to tuck it and take off downfield either. The decision making and cool demeanor are what sets him apart from many prospects entering the NFL.

NFL - People's champ with rags-to-riches story arc culminating in one of the greatest one-year turnarounds in sports history. He's self-assured and plays with competitive toughness that teammates will gravitate toward instantly. He's a rhythm passer who benefited from tempo and scheme, but his vision, touch and read recognition made the offense special.



Clyde Edwards-Helaire

DLF - Vision and decision making. He has the vision to see the plays and blocking develop, and the quickness and burst to hit his lane.

NFL - Compact, sudden back who runs low to the ground with power and balance to break tackles and the agility to bob, weave and shake them in tight quarters. Edwards-Helaire runs with instinctive eyes and quick-cut foot speed. He doesn't really have tells or tendencies and can alter the rush track when needed, which makes him so unpredictable for defenses.



CeeDee Lamb

DLF - Body control/ball skills. There is so much to like about Lamb's game. He's incredibly refined across the board. The most impressive part of his game, though, is his body control. Lamb has the innate ability to contort his body and latch onto the ball if it's even remotely near his vicinity.

NFL - Explosive, three-level playmaker and vital cog in one of the most potent offensive machines in college football over the last three seasons. Lamb uses speed and separation quickness to dominate competition in a scheme that frequently created open throws in space.



Jerry Jeudy

DLF - Entering Alabama as a four-star prospect and the total package at receiver, Jeudy endured a quiet freshman season before exploding as a sophomore. Jeudy led his team in all receiving categories in his second season before the balance of the Crimson Tide receiving corps impacted his numbers this past season. Weighing in under 200 pounds, there are some concerns about Jeudy's size, but he is such a well-developed prospect, that shouldn't matter. He's a lock to be drafted in the first round and is the favorite to be the WR1.

NFL - Mixes tight, crisp route-running with impressive top-end speed to keep secondaries on eggshells throughout the game. Jeudy is high-cut and a little leggy in his press release and short-area movements, but fluid hips and above-average agility prevent any stagnation. He's a linear route specialist with a great feel for leveraging and then stemming defenders away from his food on intermediate and deep passes.



Tua Tagovailoa

DLF - Football IQ and Accuracy. He is a surgeon from the pocket. He delivers a very tight ball with fantastic placement. He can accurately throw the ball in all quadrants of the field and on all three levels. His ability to process information and progress through his reads is probably the best in his class, and may be the best we've seen from a quarterback prospect in the last couple of years.

NFL - Talented dual-threat quarterback with winning background, explosive production and loads of experience in high-leverage games. He may be pigeon-holed into a spread or RPO-heavy attack, but he's actually a clean fit in a pro-style attack filled with play-action and roll-outs. He has the release, accuracy and touch needed to work all three levels successfully and can become a more disciplined, full-field reader to piece the puzzle together against NFL coverages.



Jonathan Taylor

DLF - The second gear he possesses is flat-out silly. He uses power to blast through tackles and has good contact balance. When he hits open field he has the ability to reach top speed quickly and pull away for long runs. Power is his second-best skill. He's a bigger back and tough to bring down. Speed plus power – it's easy to see why he gained over 6,000 yards in three years.

NFL - Supremely productive, well-built runner with an all-day, every-day mentality that helped lead him to three Big Ten rushing titles. Taylor runs with bend and burst as an outside runner and has home-run speed once he gets into the open field.



Tee Higgins

DLF - Higgins catches just about everything thrown his way. He has really strong hands and attacks the ball while it's in transit. He does a good job at extending to make catches overhead or out to his side. After the catch, he secures the ball and quickly moves upfield. His hands are about as sticky as they come.

NFL - Long, angular frame with cheat-code body control and ball skills when attacking downfield. Higgins is leggy getting off of the press, but those same leggy strides are weapons of separation that help create big plays. He's played all three receiver spots and can be moved around to match up against cornerbacks.



Denzel Mims

DLF - Mims is a very good wide receiver and his prospect profile is almost flawless. He has the production and the athletic metrics to make him one of the top players in this year's draft. Not only that, but he is proven to be a reliable playmaker on tape.

NFL - Mims is a long-striding outside target with excellent height, weight and speed and an insane catch-radius. He's a touchdown threat anytime he's near the red zone, with the focus and body control to finesse and finish catches above the rim.






D'Andre Swift

DLF - Vision/Elusiveness. Swift isn't a perfect back, but he does a lot of things well. One of his biggest strengths is his vision. He is very patient behind the line of scrimmage and has tremendous burst to hit the hole hard once he identifies his running lanes. He has a very natural feel for cutback lanes and has the instincts to wait for things to develop as he's pressing forward. Swift is probably best suited for an inside zone scheme, but I don't think there's a scheme he wouldn't perform well in.

NFL - Swift possesses the play traits and running style of a skillful NFL veteran and is the latest in an avalanche of talented Georgia backs. Tempo and decisiveness are his calling cards, making him a highly talented inside/outside zone runner.



Cole Kmet

DLF - Kmet, like most rookie tight ends, does not project to be an immediate fantasy contributor. He projects well as an eventual starter who will take some time to develop before truly becoming hitting his full potential. His landing spot could push his development and the scheme he plays in.

NFL - Long bodied, early entry Y tight end prospect who is a better pass threat than run blocker at this stage. Kmet should continue to fill out his frame, but his run blocking is too scattered and needs better focus and efficiency as a pro. He can be jammed and slowed by early contact into his route, but once he's striding, he becomes a legitimate second-level threat with sneaky separation speed and intriguing ball skills.



Adam Trautman

Fantasy Pros - Trautman is a good athlete who is still learning the nuances of being a tight end but who has a high ceiling. In terms of landing spots, it would be hard to find a better one than New Orleans. The Saints moved up in the third round to grab him and will look to find ways to get him on the field in his first year.

NFL - Right now, Trautman is a big, pass-catching tight end who needs to prove he can transition from his level of competition and handle bigger, more physical coverage dogging him around the field.



Jacob Eason

DLF - Eason – the prospect and the player – isn't for everyone. He has never wowed from a film or an analytics standpoint and losing his job to fellow 2020 NFL Draft prospect Jake Fromm isn't easily forgotten in the mind of dynasty owners. His future will be very heavily dependent on draft capital and landing spot and with a very competitive quarterback landscape in dynasty

NFL - His elite size and arm talent are reminiscent of Carson Palmer, but issues with pocket poise and getting through progressions cleanly are more reminiscent of Brock Osweiler. Eason is fun to watch when he's ripping throws around the field and taking deep play-action shots, but a lack of mobility inside and outside the pocket is troubling, considering his ineffectiveness when pressured.
